Website, Facebook and selected events


Laperousemuseum.org – continues to attract visitors. There are now 54 pages and 76 posts.

2013 Annual General Meeting

The 2013 Annual General Meeting held on Sunday 18th November was addressed by the Hon. Don Harwin MLC, President of the NSW Legislative Council and Patron of the Friends.

The lively topic was "The Ties That Bind Us" and covered the wide ranging relationship between Australians and the French, from Lapérouse's arrival on our shores on the 26th January 1788 to today.

The relationship is not only based on Lapérouse landing in that part of Botany Bay which today is known as in what today is known as Frenchman's

Bay and the headland suburb of La Perouse, but in the involvement of many other French explorers, the names of many of our suburbs such as Sans Souci and Vaucluse; the colours of the Eastern Suburbs Rugby League club known as "the Roosters", many street names, the bilingual French School The Lycée Condorcet, but also the deep social, cultural and commercial relations that exist between our two nations.

Bastille Day - 14 July



Bastille Day this year was hosted by Randwick Council's La Perouse Museum & Headland Trust in conjunction with The Friends. All financial members of the Friends were invited at no cost to the function.

Over 250 persons attended the ceremony at the Laperouse Monument where the Coast Seniors Centre Choir gave splendid renditions of both the French and Australian national anthems.

The function was addressed by the President of the NSW Legislative Council and Patron of The Friends, the Hon. Don Harwin; his Worship the Mayor of Randwick Councillor Scott Nash and Mr Eric Berti Consul-General of France.





The La Perouse Museum & Headland Trust

The La Perouse Museum & Headland Trust was formed in December 2013 to provide advice to Randwick City Council for the management of the Museum and the La Perouse headland.

The Committee nominated honorary secretary Tony Gentile to represent The Friends. Other members of the Trust are:

- The Mayor (up to last September Councillor Scott Nash)
- Three Councillors (up to last September Deputy Mayor Councillor Anthony Andrews; and Councillors Tony Bowen and Murray Matson).
- Ms Marcia Ella-Duncan representing the La Perouse Aboriginal Land Council
- Mr Peter Hay representing National Parks and Wildlife Service
- Mr Eric Berti French Consul-General (with Ms Nicole Forrest Green as his alternative) and
- Mrs Petula Samios as the Community Representative with heritage expertise.

This last position is appointed by Council and is the sole remunerated representative.

Aside from the sponsoring of functions at the Museum, progress has been slow as the legal process necessary to sign over a lease of the Museum and the headland to Randwick Council has not as yet been finalised. This is likely to occur in the second half of 2015.

<u>Exhibits / Artefacts - Museum Items Record Keeping</u> Project

The Friends have been keen participant in a project to catalogue all exhibits and artefacts in the Museum. The group has been led by Museum Curator Elizabeth Broomhead. Professor Margaret Sankey, Professor Ivan Barko, Mrs Carole Roussel, Mrs Gail Tring and Mr Charles Abela have all taken part in the project.

Phase I of the project has been completed. The next phase will involve data entry of all the exhibits which will, on completion, be available for access on-line by the general public.

Educational Funding from French Parliament

An application submitted by Committee member Nicole Forrest Green for funding from the French Parliament for the Friends of the Laperouse Museum, under a Member's private parliamentary reserve for 2015 was approved September 22. The amount of the grant will be around AUD 7500 and the funding is earmarked for an educational/historical program in French and English, aimed at schools and overseas visitors.

Lapérouse History Booklet

The Lapérouse Society in Albi France kindly made available a booklet on Lapérouse for publication in Australia in English. Two companies have been approached and are considering the sponsorship and publication of the booklet titled: 'Lapérouse sailing through the Enlightenment' currently produced by the 'Mairie' (City Council) of Albi in France for the Lapérouse Museum, Albi.

Offer for a Reception

The Friends have been invited to hold a fund raising reception at Trevor Kennedy's heritage premises at the Rocks which houses a portion of his private collection of historical non-indigenous Australian Art and artifacts valued in excess of AUD 30 million. Trevor has generously offered to host the function, in the first quarter of next year.

TREASURERS REPORT

I present to you the accounts for the Financial Year ending 30^{th} June, 2014.

Income from Membership was \$ 2160 compared with \$ 1765 for the previous year and \$1565 in 2012 representing a steady increase in membership. Interest from the FOLM Term Deposit was \$ 904.74 and donations and sales totalled \$ 149.

In December, 2013 FOLM purchased a model of "Boussole", flagship of the Laperouse Expedition which is now on exhibition in the Museum.

To secure the opportunity for this purchase required an early withdrawal from FOLM Term Deposit (\$1884.29) with the account balance of \$18,000 remaining in the Term Deposit until the maturity date of 3.10.14 and subsequently in accordance with our instructions the adjusted interest of \$642.47 was transferred to FOLM Community Fee Saver Account. The \$18,000 is again reinvested for another year (3.10.15).

To assist with the purchase of Boussole a call to members for contributions subsequently raised \$2180.

Honouring George Brouet

A Long Standing "Friend" Honoured

Georges BROUET was born in Rouen (Seine-Maritime) on 29 April 1922. He was educated in various schools until getting the brevet élémentaire as a fitter and turner. At the age of 17, he joined the French Navy (Marine nationale) in Cherbourg to enlist at the Engineers' School. On reaching the depot, he was sent to a Coastguard sloop leaving for the North Sea fishing grounds. In late August 1939, visiting Newcastle-on-Tyne, the ship was recalled to Cherbourg.

The Second World War started and the ship was refitted as a minesweeper. It operated in the North Sea and English Channel, taking part in the evacuation of troops and civilians in May/June 1940 ("Operation Dynamo") from the main ports on the French coast to the coast of England.

Following the fall of France, he was in Portsmouth and joined the Royal Navy, later transferring to the Free French Navy (Forces Navales Françaises Libres) in July 1940. He was sent to Aldershot where he trained as a marine (fusilier marin). He took part in Operation Menace (Battle of Dakar, September 1940). In October 1940, at Freetown (Sierra Leone), he transferred to the Free French ship 'Savorgnan de Brazza', which operated around the coast of Africa and in the Red Sea.

Later, in 1942, the ship took part in escort duties in the Atlantic and Indian Oceans, as well as the Red Sea. Eventually the ship reached Australia (Fremantle, Sydney) and escorted US Navy ships in the Pacific. He fell ill and was hospitalised in Sydney in late 1944. In February 1945, he returned to France via the Royal Navy and visited his family whom he not seen for five years. He then joined the 'Bataillon du Pacfique' and was shipped to Nouméa and thence to Port Kembla. He was demobilized in Sydney in June 1946 and married a young lady who had visited him in hospital. As a motor mechanic, he worked for several companies, but principally "Detroit Diesel Allison".

Georges joined the 'Free French Association' (Association Française Libre) Section Australie in 1946, and later became Secretary, Treasurer and finally President of this association. He has been a regular attender of ex-service functions, where French and Australian ex-servicemen gather, as well as other Franco-Australian cultural events. He is a chevalier (knight) of both the Légion d'Honneur and the Ordre National du Mérite, as well as being decorated with the Croix de guerre and other medals.
